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Scripture References: All references to Scriptures in this book are taken from the New King James Version (NKJV) unless otherwise indicated by a three to nine character translation code as shown on pages 8-9.

Author's Comments In [[text]] or [text] Brackets: The Amplified Bible uses parentheses around some (text) and brackets around other [text] to enhance Scripture understanding. If you see double brackets around [[text]] within any Scripture, or [text] outside of Scripture, it indicates that this is an author's comment or explanation from his perspective.

Capitalization Protocol

On all Bible citations, regardless of the translation used and where the context clearly points to God Almighty or to Jesus Christ, this book distinguishes between the two. This is done by using either small-cap characters or lowercase characters.

For God Almighty, a small capitalized style protocol is followed and reflected in the format: Creator, Father, Almighty, Giver, He, His, Him, Himself, You, Your, Me, Mine, Most High, My, Myself, Lord and Savior, Etc.

For Jesus Christ, a lowercase protocol is used except for Lord and Son. Hence, when these pronouns are used for Jesus, they show up as: he, his, him, himself, you, your, me, my, myself, savior, Lord, or Son.

This has generally been followed throughout the book but is not the case with every cited verse. It is used for those verses in which the context cannot be easily disputed, or in the case of citing, a quality or attribute which belongs solely to God.

For those interested in the original translation capitalization, the author refers them to the actual Bible version used for the cited text. A list of Bible translations is shown on the next page. In other cases, capital letters used within the mentioned sentence structure were also changed on common words for ease of reading or modern grammar. In other cases, the capitalized letters were left as shown in the original translation. Hence the original Bible phrase "; Because" might appear as "; because." In all instances, the author maintains complete integrity of translation, and the writings herein can be traced back to the original Bibles to confirm the accuracy of presentation. While not perfect, the capitalization protocol is reasonably consistent and enhances the reading and value of the author's writings.

CHAPTER TWO Those Who Love God

Know Their Bible

An estimated 85% of Christians have not and do not read the Christian Holy Bible. In fact, many churches prefer that their congregants don't read the Bible. Why is that a reality in Christendom? Promoting Orthodox Church doctrines like the Trinity and salvation only through Jesus is made easier.

Many people, even myself, have never found a need to pick up the Bible until some external event took place. For me, it was the epiphany I had at age 32 that I discussed in the Introduction chapter. When I studied my Bible, I soon found myself in a state of confusion. I would read my Bible, and then, in the "Church of Christ" that I attended on Sundays, the Pastor would often teach directly opposite the Scriptures I had read earlier in the week. Once I returned home, I would quickly review the Bible text I had read earlier. It didn't take me long to realize that my local church and its denomination had its

own agenda and even taught against the Scriptures. I quickly took my family out of that church and found a more Bible-compatible¹ one.

Lesson #1 for those who love God: Orthodox Christian Churches teach man-made doctrines, local church policies, and even directly against what Jesus taught in the Scriptures.

Lesson #2 for those who love God: When you stand on God's Holy Scriptures, you might find they go against the local church and denomination's teaching. This will get you in trouble with the church leadership, who might not appreciate an actual Bible reader.

Lesson #3 for those who love God: Dig deep enough into the Holy Scriptures, and you might find few Christian Churches teach what Jesus taught. That happened to me when my Bible studies revealed that Jesus taught a different God than the Orthodox Christian Church was teaching.

Lesson #4 for those who love God: Trinitarian Christian Churches teach Jesus but do not teach what Jesus taught. Instead, they focus on the Apostle Paul's Epistles and teachings.

Consider these simple teachings about God and Jesus' identities. I'd be willing to bet that the Pastor or Priest of your church won't discuss these Scriptures.

Jesus said: "But now you seek to kill me, a <u>Man</u> who has told *you* the truth I heard from God [[Yahweh]]." John 8:40

Jesus said: "Do not cling to me, for I have not ascended to my FATHER [[YAHWEH]]; but go to my brethren and say to them, 'I am ascending to my FATHER and *your* FATHER, and to my God [[YAHWEH]] and *your* God [[YAHWEH]]."' John 20:17

But he [[Jesus]] answered them saying,

"Who is my mother, or my brothers

[[or my sisters]]? And he [[Jesus]] looked
around in a circle at those who sat about
him, and said, "here are my mother and
my brothers [[and my sisters]]! For whoever
does the will of God is my brother and
my sister and mother." Mark 3:33-35

Meditate On Jesus' Teachings

Suppose you meditate on these teachings of Jesus. In that case, you will come to the following twelve realities of church teachings that teach against what Jesus taught in the Bible. Why?

- 1) Jesus was a man.
- 2) Jesus was a man who heard God's voice².
- 3) Jesus taught us the truth that God conveyed to him.
- 4) Jesus was returning to God, who sent him.
- 5) Jesus had a God that he worshipped.
- 6) Jesus taught us that the FATHER is the only God.
- 7) Jesus taught us that his FATHER was our FATHER.
- 8) Jesus taught us that his God was our God [YAHWEH].
- 9) Jesus worshipped the God of the Jews [YAHWEH].
- 10) Jesus had family relationships.
- 11) Jesus is our brother, not our God.
- 12) Jesus is your brother *IF* you are doing the will of God.

Of course, Jesus' teachings concerning the identity of God³ are more extensive than the three verses I've shown above. I've quoted from the New King James Version (NKJV). Still, the verses are identical or similar in all popular Bible versions. If you believe Jesus is your God,

you owe it to yourself to get the truth by studying all of Jesus' teachings in a red-lettered New Testament Bible. Jesus is not God, but he taught us all about God's love and true identity.

Lesson #5 for those who love God: You realize that the Trinity doctrine is man-made and doesn't align with the actual teachings of Jesus.

Lesson #6 for those who love God: You've discovered Jesus' teachings and now realize the Orthodox Christian Church is lying about the identities of Jesus and God [YAHWEH].

Lesson #7 for those who love God: Upon further studies, you realize that the Trinity doctrine is not found anywhere in the Holy Bible. The Trinity is pure conjecture and fundamentally gaslighting and dogma from religious scholars. It is based on the Greek text "ego eimi" used in the "I am" statements in the Gospel of John.

However, if I said: "I am Edward," does that make me God? The blind man Jesus healed used the exact Greek text "ego eimi" in the New Testament. It also didn't make him God. It is and has always been a self-identifier. It's no different than saying I am and then stating your name. You can find a complete study about the identities of God and Jesus in my book "God And Jesus: The Identity Crisis⁴." The New Testament's use of the Greek text "ego eimi" is illustrated and discussed.

The most damming case against the Trinity Doctrine promoted by so-called "religious scholars" are the actual teachings of Jesus in the New Testament. Jesus would dismiss the doctrine as being man-made per Matthew 15. The doctrine negates God's First Commandment and replaces the ONE God with a man-made Trinitarian God tradition.

For those serious about Jesus, the above twelve realities of his may be the awakening of God's Spirit within you. For all the rest of the Christians who do not read their bibles or care, they will not be disturbed by these teachings of Jesus.

Suppose you dare discuss the Scriptures above or any of the numerous related teachings of Jesus with Bibleignorant people. In that case, they will think you're nuts. After all, the Pastor or Priest knows what's what and wouldn't lie to you. You might also hear: "Jesus is God you heretic, get the facts straight!" Followed by, "You're not welcomed in our fellowship if you hold such beliefs."

This is where the cultural programming of our families and minds becomes the central reality for all Christians, except those studying the Bible. For most of us, Jesus' teachings didn't program us. It was church gaslighting, doctrine, and dogma that programmed us. From our earliest childhood memories, we were taught that Jesus loves us and is God. He became human and

died on the cross for our sins. From childhood, we all probably sang, "Jesus loves me this I know, 'cause the Bible tells me so." We also lit candles at various religious events and sang, "This little light of mine, I'm going to let it shine."

The reality is that ever since 325 CE, our families have been programmed to believe and accept the Trinity doctrine in Christianity that declared Jesus as our God. Starting around 500 CE, the Church also began a period where people who would not profess a belief that Jesus was God were actually hunted and killed. The purpose was to purge heretics, defined as those who would not accept the Trinity doctrine. This drove everyone with opposing theologies underground.

Caution: For those involved in Christian Bible study groups. Odds⁵ are 95% that if you are in a Christian Bible study, it will be within a group that believes Jesus is God. You must be sensitive if you bring up Jesus' teachings for discussion. Many who study the Bible are well-schooled in rationalizing the Trinity Doctrine. This means they read into Scripture that Jesus is God even though that is not what Scripture says.

There is a simple rule for Bible study I recommend to avoid confusion and mental stress. You can't create or support a doctrine if opposing Scripture exists. This means that when Jesus identifies his God and our God as being the FATHER or YAHWEH in John 20:17, no one can assert that Jesus is God by claiming the Trinity Doctrine as the only truth. If you love Jesus, you must accept what Jesus taught. Otherwise, it means denying the Lord Jesus being claimed as one's Savior.

"But why do you call me 'Lord, Lord,' and do not do the things which I say? Whoever comes to me, and hears my sayings and does them, I will show you whom he is like: He is like a man building a house, who dug deep and laid the foundation on the rock. And when the flood arose, the stream beat vehemently against that house, and could not shake it, for it was founded on the rock." Luke 6:46-48

I don't think any of the above revelations are cause for major mental trauma. At least not if you truly love Jesus. However, just the knowledge in your mind might cause some consternation about staying within the current fellowship you attend. That assumes you attend church somewhere regularly.

Absorbing Jesus' Teachings

Remember the parable of the "sower of seed" that Jesus taught in Matthew 13:18-23? Before I reveal more troubling Bible issues, you'll need to decide what kind of hearer of God's Word you are. Is your faith in God strong enough to withstand the intellectual oddities about the Holy Bible we take for granted as being the truth from God to humans? There is no single Bible I am aware of that is without errors.

Not even the venerated King James Bible of 1611. If you think the KJV Bible⁶ is without error, search the KJV Bible on the word "repent." You'll quickly find that God does not repent according to Numbers 23:19. However, you'll also see in the KJV Bible several ways that God does repent. Newer Bibles, such as the NKJV, have fixed these KJV errors. Do you absorb God's Word into your heart, or does it scare you? Does it scare you that there are historical accuracy and contradictions within Scripture? What about the fact that the organized Orthodox Church often teaches against what Jesus taught in Scripture. Does that scare you? If you love God, you'll have to recognize the difference between issues of faith and those of the intellect. I'll discuss the intellectual roadblocks to faith in Chapter 7, so stay tuned for a deeper dive into God's Word. What kind of hearer of God's Word do you think you are?

Matthew 13: 18-23

Jesus said, 18 "Therefore hear the parable of the sower: 19 When anyone hears the word of the kingdom, and does not understand it, then the wicked one comes and snatches away what was sown in his heart. This is he who received seed by the wayside.

Comment: When their mind fails to understand the Word, this hearer of God's Word quickly loses what was sown and retreats to unbelief. God's Word does not sink into their heart!

20 But he who received the seed on stony places, this is he who hears the word and immediately receives it with joy;

21 yet he has no root in himself, but endures only for a while. For when tribulation or persecution arises because of the word, immediately he stumbles.

Comment: When tribulation or persecution presents itself, this hearer of God's Word retreats to unbelief. This could be someone who gets into trouble with an Orthodox Church by confronting religious authorities about Scripture truths taught by Jesus.

22 Now he who received seed among the thorns is he who hears the word, and the cares of this world and the deceitfulness of riches choke the word, and he becomes unfruitful.

Comment: When life's trouble presents itself, this hearer of God's Word retreats to unbelief. This is someone trying to walk on the narrow path to eternity and finds they are out of step with the masses. It might be someone losing a job because of their religious beliefs. It could be someone uncomfortable not following the crowd or being with their friends.

23 But he who received seed on the good ground is he who hears the word and understands it, who indeed bears fruit and produces: some a hundredfold, some sixty, some thirty." Matthew 13:18-23

Comment: This person stands firm on God's Word and doesn't let errors or intellectual oddities take away the love of God, evidenced by the Spirit that resides within their heart. This person stands firm on God's righteousness and is not deterred by the dogma and doctrines of church authorities. These people know that God is real and have established a personal relationship with HIM [YAHWEH], having been brought back to God through the teachings of our Lord Jesus Christ (1 John 5:20).

"And we know that the Son of God [[Jesus]] has come and has given us an understanding, that we may know HIM [[YAHWEH]] who is true; and we are in HIM [[YAHWEH]] who is true, in HIS [[YAHWEH'S]] Son Jesus Christ. This [[YAHWEH]] is the true God and eternal life." 1 John 5:20

If you've made it this far, congratulations. It means you have an earnest faith and can accept that there is a difference between what Jesus taught and what the Orthodox⁷ Church is teaching. However, many other controversial subjects, even errors, exist concerning the Bible that can cause doubt in even the most serious believer's mind. I know of one evangelical Christian who lost his faith in God after discovering historical and critical Bible text errors. I will discuss these issues in detail in the Chapter, "Intellectual Roadblocks." For now, consider the following two Bible historical text oddities. Do either of these disturb your faith in God? They shouldn't, as they are issues for intellectual discussions,

not issues involving a sincere faith in our hearts.

Genealogy of Jesus: You'll find two different genealogy lists of ancestors for Jesus. In Matthew 1:1-17, 44 generations are listed. In Luke 3:23-38, 77 generations are listed, a significantly different list of ancestors. Luke's list goes all the way back to Adam. However, there is no historical record or biblical idea of who the grandfather of Jesus was, as the two lists have different names for who the grandfather should be.

Women at the tomb: The synoptic Gospels all have different versions of who visited the tomb of Jesus after he was buried. This inconsistency disturbs religious scholars who seek certainty and historical accuracy. The number of women ranges from **two** in Matthew (28:1), **three** in Mark (16:1), and **three or more** in Luke (24:1). Obviously, some historical error must exist within these differing accounts. Which gospel account is correct, and does it even matter?

Comment: These gospel accounts were written by different authors with diverse inputs, perspectives, and knowledge. Therefore, you cannot expect unanimity in their stories.

It was in May 1978, at the age of 32, when I had an epiphany, and in an instant, I was filled with God's Spirit. I have walked with God for 47 years. For the first twelve years, I absorbed Scripture. sincere heart. This prayer comes from within the bowels of my spirit soul, and I fully understand that this is a one-way decision of my committed heart.

FATHER, I believe in YOUR only human begotten Son, Jesus Christ. I believe that YOU sent Christ down to this earth and that he became the human being Jesus Christ [Yashua] in the flesh, just like the flesh I have. I believe he had bones like I do, flesh like I do, and blood like I do. I believe that his body on the cross was no different from any other human body. I acknowledge Jesus Christ is the Son of God; he is not God.

Having said this, FATHER, I pray that you will dwell within me and help me be the man [or woman] you want me to be. I ask all this in the name of Jesus Christ, whom I confess with my mouth that he came in the flesh as Your only begotten Son. I acknowledge with my heart that You expect righteousness, a new life with changed behavior that glorifies You.

FATHER, help me to be an instrument of YOUR will even as Christ was such an instrument. Let this day be the first day of the rest of my life, and help me to put away all offensive behavior and sin, which YOU hate. I pray in the name of YOUR only begotten and beloved human Son, lesus. **AMEN**
